Fox River Cleanup Project

The Fox River Cleanup Project is moving forward toward its goal of reducing the levels of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) in the river through a combination of dredging and capping.

Dredging and/or capping will take place from Little Rapids to the mouth of the river over the next nine years with oversight by the Wisconsin DNR and U.S. EPA. Dredging and processing resumed on April 18 for the 2011 season.

The project should not interfere with boating or fishing on the Fox River.

The safety of boaters, anglers and others using the river is a top priority.

Boaters and anglers should be aware of the activity that will be taking place on the river as part of the project.

Several different buoys and markers will be used along the river.

In 2010, the project dredged more than 720,000 cubic yards of sediment for a two year total of approximately 1.2 million cubic yards.

Totals for 2010...

Estimated volume of sediment dredged - 720,759 cubic yards

Estimated amount of processed sediment produced 365.627 tons

Estimated tonnage hauled to landfill - 378,291 tons

Truckloads to landfill - 16,050

Water treated and discharged to the river - 881,430,000 gallons

As of April, the project has exceeded 800,000 work hours without a lost time incident (not including transportation hours).

No capping or covering took place in 2010.


Lighted orange and white buoys alert watercraft to the pipeline area.

Attention Membership:

Member Proposal Process

Fill out gold "New Member Proposal Form" found next to the bulletin board.

Attend a Board of Directors meeting and bring the form to present to the Board.

The proposals are posted for one month on the bulletin board. If there are no objections to the proposed members then they will be approved by the Board at the next meeting.

Once approved, an application and letter is sent to the sponsors.

The sponsor is responsible for having the proposed member fill out and return the application to the club within 60 days. The order in which the applications are returned is the order placed on the Wait List.

If the application is not returned, a letter is sent to the sponsor stating the pending applicant was terminated. Failure to return the application prior to the stated date will still count towards yearly sponsorship.

Beginning this year, members are allowed two sponsorships.
